The program was presented by Susan Sanders, a meteorologist from the Rapid City National Weather Service office. Also attending was guest Markus Erk, who provided some of the storm photographs in the presentation.

Susan covered the following topics:

- * how to recognize a developing tornado,
- * how to report severe storms to the National Weather Service and local officials, and
- * how to protect yourself from storms.

The National Weather Service relies on ground-truth storm reports from spotters to supplement forecasting tools like the Doppler radar and automated weather stations.

Tornado Formation

Supercell Thunderstorms - shows side view, from "How Tornadoes Form" by Paul Markowski Updraft 30,000 to 60,000 feet high

Wall Cloud - look for horizontal rotation

Downdraft - 2 kinds: 1) Main Storm, with rain and hail, and 2) Rear Flank

Making a storm report

- * Who you are
- * Where you are:
 - Spotter ID
 - Street Address
 - Nearest Intersection
 - Latitude/Longitude
- * When the storm or flooding started, how long it lasted
- * Damage

For Tornadoes, Funnel Clouds, or Wall Clouds

Where: Direction of tornado from your location, mention a landmark

Flooding:

Where: streams, road crossing, street

Water depth and movement

Impacts

Thunderstorms

Hail > 1/2" diameter

Wind Gusts > 50 mph

Heavy rain: 1" per hour
